## *Governor Gavin Newsom Calls for Creation of a Master Plan for Aging*


*Executive Order N-14-19*

Governor's [Executive Order](#) calls for the Secretary of the Health and Human Services (HHS) Agency to convene a cabinet-level Workgroup for Aging to advise the Secretary in developing and issuing the Master Plan.

The order also directs HHS to convene a Master Plan for Aging Stakeholder Advisory Committee, which will include a Research Subcommittee and a Long-Term Care Subcommittee with an interest in building an age-friendly California.

# Partnering Cross-Sector

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## Building on California's Strengths

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- California for All: Goals of Equity & Inclusion
- Comprehensive Medicaid program, including Medicaid Expansion and range of Long-Term Services and Supports (LTSS)
- Robust Home and Community-Based Services (HCBS) Programs, to avoid institutional care
  - In 2016 California ranked 8<sup>th</sup> in the nation in HCBS spending as a percent of LTSS spending (57% in CA compared to 45% nationally)
- Prior Task Force Analyses and Master Plans

## Setting & Achieving Person-Centered, Data-Driven Goals

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As more and more diverse Californians live longer:

- We will be able to live where we choose as we age and have the help we and our families need to do so.
- We will live in and be engaged in age-friendly communities.
- We will maintain our health and well-being as we age.
- We will have economic security and be safe from abuse, neglect, and exploitation throughout our lives.

## Deliverables By October 2020: Master Plan for Aging

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1. Roadmap for state with person-centered goals, data indicators, and partnerships;
2. Blueprint for local communities to adapt and adopt;
3. Resource toolkit that includes model policies and best practices;
4. Data dashboard of state and local indicators to monitor progress on ten-year targets; and
5. Long-Term Care Report from Stakeholders (March 2020).

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- Housing/Aging in Place 31% (Financial concerns often mentioned)
- Health Care 16% (Financial concerns often mentioned)
- Transportation 15%
- Home and Community-Based Services/ Long-Term Care 15%
- Information and Referral 6%
- Family Caregiver Services 4%
- Employment 3%
- Other 10% (Accessibility, Ageism, Elder Abuse, Nutrition)

- Spring 2020:
  - Continue Development of Deliverables
  - Submit Long-Term Services & Supports Report from Stakeholders to Governor
- Summer 2020:
  - Complete Draft Deliverables
  - Complete Stakeholder Feedback
  - Finalize Cabinet-level Workgroup Review
- Fall 2020:
