Long-Term Care Subcommittee Report

Our charge:

The Executive Order calls on the Long-Term Care Subcommittee to report to the Governor by March 2020 on, but not limited to, the following:

1. The growth and sustainability of state long-term care programs and infrastructure, including In-Home Supportive Services.
2. An examination of access to long-term care, financing for long-term care services and the quality of long-term care provided in a variety of settings.
3. An examination of the impact of program instability and other factors on labor supply and retention of the workforce providing long-term care services and supports.
4. Recommendations to stabilize long-term care services, including IHSS, as a foundation for implementing the Master Plan.

Retracing our steps:

- October 2019 Subcommittee formed
- Goal set for subcommittee, Master Plan values agreed to
- Today is our 8th Deep Dive
- Hundreds of stakeholder comments/recommendations
- Public comment
- Framework adopted: Cross-cutting, Pathways to Care, Access to Care, LTSS Affordability
- Subcommittee members self-identified as writing team captains
- Every recommendation reviewed, assigned, considered
- Each team (4) produced a draft January 24
- Consolidated initial, draft report produced January 27

Initial, draft report details

- 27 pages (now, at 12 pt. font)
- 5 priorities (now)
- 42 recommendations (now)

Still to come...

- Format/design work (graphics, photos, quotes)
- Person-centered framework
- Table of contents
- Appendix (all recommendations)

What this initial, first draft is/isn't

Is:

- Focused squarely on LTSS
- A start, the beginning
- Our best attempt to date to catalogue, organize and prioritize
- High-level
- The “what” not the “how”
- Intended for multiple audiences

Isn't

- The Master Plan for Aging
- Consensus document
- Final report
- Fully vetted
- Granular
